Cayton worked briefly as a political reporter for the Seattle Post-Intelligencer before

establishing The Seattle Republican. With his wife Susie as associate editor, the publication became Seattle's second largest newspaper before ending its run in 1913. Cayton then published his second newspaper, Cayton's Weekly until 1920. In

both newspapers, he fought for the rights of African Americans, facing numerous threats as well as arrests because of his provocative editorials. As an activist, he was a founding member of the Seattle branch of the NAACP and served other community organizations. Cayton and his wife became Seattle's most prominent African American couple. His newspapers now serve as historical


