Dr. Jeanne Spurlock

Pioneer in the field of child psychiatry, Dr. Jeanne Spurlock was a researcher, professor, author and psychiatrist specializing in Black family life. She was the first African American and woman to be recognized for outstanding contributions to the field of clinical psychiatry and in 1988, awarded for furthering mental health treatment of African Americans. She is considered a trailblazer for women in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) fields.

A negative experience in a hospital at age nine convinced her of the need for more caring doctors. Spurlock graduated Howard University College of Medicine in 1947 and with few African Americans entering psychiatry, she completed a residency program at Cook County Hospital in Chicago, Illinois. During the 1960's she continued her medical training, working in various positions and her own private practice. By 1973, Spurlock had become the visiting scientist at the National Institute of Mental Health. A year later, she became deputy medical director for the American Psychiatric Association – a position she held until 1991.

Spurlock was also an activist; lobbying law makers in Washington D.C to fund medical education programs for minorities and serving on numerous editorial boards. She published academic articles on sexism, the effects of racism on childhood development, the cultural misunderstandings within mental health and suggested therapy practices for people of color. During her lectures, she spoke of the importance of understanding the impact of social stresses and discrimination when working with patients of other races and cultures. She was the 1990 Guardian for Children Award recipient from the National Black Child Development Institute and won a Special Presidential Commendation from the American Psychiatry Association. One of her final projects, Black Psychiatrists and American Psychiatry, describes the experience of African American psychiatrists in academia, research, psychoanalysis and community psychiatry.




